- Positive Action for Refugees and Asylum Seekers (PAFRAS).

At the event details of the study will be presented, and learning from Dial House @Touchstone will be shared by the service manager, Carol Gatewood. There will be the opportunity for you to share and record current work and best practice in this area. We would also like you to contribute to identifying actions to implement or test in the next year or two to improve access to or experience of mental health services for people from black or minority ethnic communities.
