To celebrate Refugee Week we are offering half-day plaster casting workshops where participants will learn the basics of casting and make a plaster piece that will contribute to a large-scale art installation celebrating diversity.

PLASTER CASTING WORKSHOPS

Participants will cast a pair of stylised 'feet' using rubber moulds that have sections of the world map on the soles, allowing people to choose an area that has significance to them. Over 1,000 pairs of plaster 'feet' will be exhibited in a large-scale installation symbolic of the multicultural city of Leeds, this will be shown at Left Bank Leeds in January 2019.

PARTNER ORGANISATIONS

We are looking for organisations to work with on the delivery of these free plaster casting workshops during Refugee Week (18-22 June). The artist Eva Mileusnic will facilitate the workshops, all equipment and materials will be provided and workshops can be held at Left Bank Leeds or in your own venue.

Venues will need to provide power, heating, easy access to a sink, sufficient space for up to 20 participants to work, tables, chairs/stools, an area to leave finished work to dry and a bin for excess plaster waste.
