Civil Society Futures is an independent inquiry into the future of civil society in England. Over two years, the inquiry aims to look at how we organise ourselves when we wish to make things better in the world and to question how to adapt for the future (see www.civilsocietyfutures.org for more info).

So far, the inquiry has engaged many people across England. We have heard that civil society really matters, but our generation is facing significant challenges. A common theme emerging from the Inquiry's work so far is people's concerns about division in society and increasing inequality. In particular, race equality issues have emerged strongly.

The Inquiry is keen to examine these issues in more detail and to identify what role civil society can play in progressing race equality in the future. brap, an equality charity based in Birmingham is supporting the Inquiry to do this. brap is working in partnership with the North East Race Equality Forum to run this event.

We're inviting you to take part in an open, honest discussion about these issues and other things you think are important in order to help inform the Inquiry's work. This should be a fun and lively discussion and people will be supported and encouraged to get their views across.
