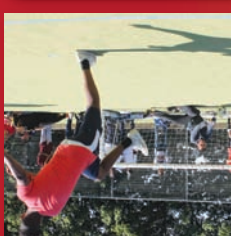

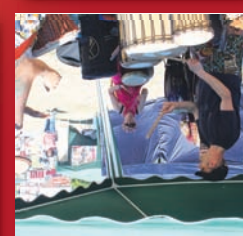
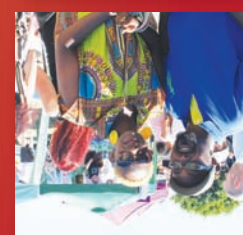


Refugee Week brings people of all ages,

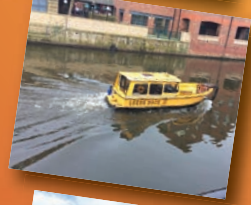
