We are aware that some hosts have now passed their second year of hosting and our payments system requires us to restart their thank you payments annually. We must call each active host to confirm their guests are still living with them and then request that their thank you payments continue. We are aware that some people's payments will have ended, but the HfU team is working to ensure any outstanding payments will be made. We have contacted hosts but wanted to make partners aware.

Case study - Dmytro and Richard's story

Dmytro is a 28-year-old man who arrived in Leeds knowing little to no English. It took time for him to settle into life in a new country. After moving in with his host, very quickly the situation changed due to unforeseen circumstances, and Dmytro felt he had no choice but to leave the host's property.

Dmytro contacted the Council's HfU team for assistance with housing and finding a new host. There were considerable challenges in supporting him, as he was classed as not being in priority need owing to being a single man. Most available hosts were unwilling to support single men, with the majority of Ukrainians on the scheme being women or children.

Dmytro was sofa surfing with a friend in Manchester and commuting every day to Leeds to see friends and access support. Owing to the urgency of the situation, the HfU team helped him with emergency accommodation.

After a few weeks with no success, the HfU team were able to rematch Dmytro with a new host, Richard, who was able to provide him with the security he needed. Both of them get on well and Dmytro has made a new friend for life. Richard also allowed Dmytro's mother to visit and stay with them.



"We are both happy! Here we are playing tennis, which we do together often." said Richard.

"Richard has been a great help, thank you so much to him and the Council for all their support", said Dmytro.

Rematching guide for hosts and guests, and housing info

Please see accompanying guidance on rematching, the steps hosts should take, and the support available to help guests find a new host or independent accommodation. Ukrainian version now included.

We are working with a number of Ukrainian guests who are bidding for social housing, who are now being offered properties they have placed bids for. Please ensure that they are only bidding on properties they would actually consider moving to, as if they refuse a reasonable offer, they could lose their housing priority. If anyone has any questions, please email us or visit the Reginald Centre on Mondays or Wednesdays.

Leave to remain queries

If any Ukrainians want to check how long their current visas are valid for, please follow these instructions:

- The Government's right to work website is a way of helping guests to check their visa status.
- Guest inputs DOB and BRP info.
- No need to generate a share code.
- www.gov.uk/view-prove-immigration-status

If someone's BRP is due to expire, please ensure they visit www.gov.uk/biometric-residence-permits/replace-expired-brp.

It is also important that guests update any changes to their details, such as if they have changed their address. This can be done at www.gov.uk/change-circumstances-visa-brp.

If anyone has a query about their visas, please note that the Leeds City Council HfU Team is not authorised to give immigration or visa advice. It is best to <u>contact UK Visas and Immigration</u>. Immigration advisers must be OISC registered. You can look for an authorised adviser at the following link - https://www.gov.uk/find-an-immigration-adviser. Please note that local organisation RETAS is now OISC registered, so they are authorised to give immigration advice.

E-Visa info sessions - please note that all the info sessions previously circulated have been cancelled.

Reporting hate crime and anti-social behaviour

Please see accompanying info in English, Russian and Ukrainian about how to report a hate crime. Please circulate this info so everyone is aware of how to report hate crimes to the Police, what is a hate crime, location of reporting centres and how people can contact other support services.

Hate crimes can be reported at the following link - <u>Hate crimes and incidents.</u>

If anyone is experiencing antisocial behaviour, they can try to speak to the person responsible, as they may not realise the effect of their actions. People should only do this if they feel safe and comfortable to do so.

If this is not possible, people can report the issue to Leeds City Council. Any type of ASB can be reported, including:

- Abuse, intimidation or harassment.
- Drug or alcohol issues.
- Vehicle related nuisance
- Threat or use of violence.
- Prostitution.
- · Antisocial use of fireworks.

ONS Ukraine survey report

The ONS has released its report following a survey of Ukrainians living in the UK. 7,594 Ukrainian adults responded. See the report <u>online here</u>. Some highlights include:

- **68**% of respondents want to remain in the UK, mostly because there are more work opportunities.
- 88% of respondents are happy with their accommodation.
- **50**% have experienced barriers to accessing private rented accommodation.
- 50% have experienced difficulties finding work in the UK.
- 88% of respondents intend to apply for the Ukraine Permission Extension Scheme.
